IT'S JUST A CURTAIN, RIGHT?


For decades, traditional fabric cubicle curtains have been the product of choice. Their use has more recently raised concerns in a COVID-era where perception of cleanliness, ease of maintenance, patient throughput, pathogen transference, safety, and patient experience scores are increasingly being analyzed in effiency.

Lower Upfront Investment

A health system can spend \$200-300 per bed for a fabric curtain, and this does not include the cost of spare curtains or those lost to laundering. Fabric curtains also entail a dated tracking system that requires 15 mins to do a changeout using a ladder. The OTRT disposable curtain costs about \$40 per bed and takes two minutes to remove/replace with no ladder needed.

Reduce Maintenance & Operating Costs

It costs about \$15-\$20 per fabric curtain for laundry transport, washing, drying, folding, and storing. This equals an abundance of time, money, and scarce storage space. With OTRT, customers have recognized up to a 90% reduction in labor, replacement, and laundry costs.

Cut Storage and Inventory

OTRT curtains come in a standard 69inch width. An integrated snap system allows you to snap multiple panels together to cover any width. When only a portion of the curtain becomes soiled, caregivers can remove/replace the soiled panel rather than the entire curtain. Additionally, storage is a breeze with a "one size fits all" single SKU. Most traditional fabric curtains are stocked in multiple sizes, widths, and colors, taking up valuable storage space and taking time to sort through. Textiles also tend to get discontinued over time causing more 'mismatch' throughout a facility.

Boost Patient Throughput & Perception of Cleanliness

Perception of cleanliness is critical to the HCAHPS patient satisfaction score used by The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to calculate a facility's Medicare and Medicaid reimbursement. HCAHPS scores for cleanliness are affected by both the reality of clean and the perception of clean. As patients and family members perceive the facility, so goes the ratings and the financial consequences. Perception becomes a reality (The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
